They are essential to the continued financial viability of Tannehill Historic Park.

Are all facets of the rule-making process designed solely for the purpose of, and so they have, as their primary effect, the protection of the public? Yes

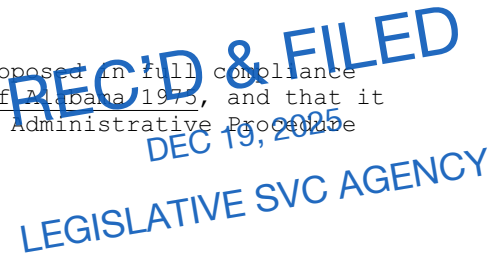

SUBSTANCE OF PROPOSED ACTION:

Increase in almost all fees charged at Tannehill Historical State Park. For most of these fees it is the first increases between five and eight years.

Rule Title: Tannehill Ironworks Historical State Park Fees

Intended Action: Amend

 This rule has no economic impact.

 Yes This rule has an economic impact, as explained below:

1. NEED/EXPECTED BENEFIT OF RULE:

The benefit is to allow the Park to remain in operation. In the past year expenses began to exceed operating costs

2. COSTS/BENEFITS OF RULE AND WHY RULES IS THE MOST EFFECTIVE, EFFICIENT, AND FEASIBLE MEANS FOR ALLOCATING RESOURCES AND ACHIEVING THE STATED PURPOSE:

The proposed fees are an absolute necessity to continue operations.

3. EFFECT OF THIS RULE ON COMPETITION:

There is none.

4. EFFECT OF THIS RULE ON COST-OF-LIVING AND DOING BUSINESS IN THE GEOGRAPHICAL AREA WHERE THE RULE IS TO BE IMPLEMENTED:

There is no "cost-of-living" factor.

5. EFFECT OF THIS RULE ON EMPLOYMENT IN THE GEOGRAPHICAL AREA WHERE THE RULE IS TO BE IMPLEMENTED:

Without the increase in fees the Park will have to close its doors and layoff its five remaining full-time employees.

6. **SOURCE OF REVENUE TO BE USED FOR IMPLEMENTING AND ENFORCING THIS RULE:**

The fees easily constitute over 95% of all annual revenue to operate the park except for an occasional small appropriation from the Alabama Legislature (\$25,000) and occasional grants. Neither of these provide even 5% of annual revenue.

7. **THE SHORT-TERM/LONG-TERM ECONOMIC IMPACT OF THIS RULE ON EFFECTED PERSONS, INCLUDING ANALYSIS OF PERSONS WHO WILL BEAR THE COSTS AND THOSE WHO WILL BENEFIT FROM THE RULE:**

These fees will benefit all patrons of the Park by keeping the gates open, provide for additional needed staffing, and to provide for park improvements and routine maintenance.

8. **UNCERTAINTIES ASSOCIATED WITH THE ESTIMATED BENEFITS AND BURDENS OF THE RULE, INCLUDING QUALITATIVE/QUANTITATIVE BENEFITS AND BURDEN COMPARISON:**

There are always uncertainties with any proposal including will the increases in fees adversely affect attendance. We would expect some minimal "short-term" negative reduction in cabin rentals and camping rentals but they should be offset by the overall fee increases.

9. **THE EFFECT OF THIS RULE ON THE ENVIRONMENT AND PUBLIC HEALTH:**

There should be no negative effect on either but additional funding should allow for better maintenance of facilities and there is no identifiable impact on public health.

10. **DETRIMENTAL EFFECT ON THE ENVIRONMENT AND PUBLIC HEALTH IF THE RULE IS NOT IMPLEMENTED:**

The Park would close.
